RESOLUTIONS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE 3rd COMMUNIST INTERNATIONAL

August 8, 1920

The Executive Committee has decided that the Communist Parties of America, viz. the United Communist Party and the Communist Party should be both immediately obliged to amalgamate and form one Party on the basis of the decisions of the 2nd World Congress of Communist International. This union should be finally completed in 2 months, i.e. not later than upon [10] October 1920. Any group failing to submit to this decision will be excluded from the Communist International.

The Executive Committee sees no reason why Comrade Fraina should not take a responsible position in the American Labor movement, as the said Comrade Fraina has equal rights with any other amongst the American comrades.
